President Barrow opens NAYCONF

r. Adama Barrow, President of the Republic of The Gambia has on Friday presided over the official opening of the 13th edition of the National Youth Conference and Festival (Nayconf) in Banjul.

The 7-day youth gathering is a biennial event that brings together young people from across the country and beyond to discuss issues of youth and national development.

The theme for this year's event is "The Role of Young People in the Maintenance of Peace and Security for Socio-Economic Development of the Country; Challenges and **Opportunities.**"

The official opening was attended by the cross-section of Gambians including cabinet ministers, regional governors, chairpersons, mayors, head of public institutions, UN system and youths from The Gambia and beyond.

President Barrow described Nayconf as one of the most important youth gatherings in the country that brings together youth from across the country and beyond to discuss issues of national development.

"I am aware that this discussion is documented in the form of resolutions that will guide the government as well as other stakeholders in addressing the concerns of the young people," he said. Mr. Barrow recalled that over the years, his government has taken previous Nayconf resolutions with utmost importance.

This, he said, is a clear manifestation that NAYCONF is not a mere gathering for merry-making and jamboree.

The theme, he said, is suitable, considering the fact that the Gambia is embracing democratic principles of accountability and transparency.

"There is a greater need for the youth to take the lead in making sure that The Gambia jealously guard its peace and security that will certainly guarantee prosperity so that generations yet unborn would be proud of all Gambians," he said.

"My government is committed to creating that platform for the youth to excel," he added.

Hon. Bakary Y. Badjie, Minister of Youth and Sports noted that Nayconf is a platform where youth showcase their talents as well as display their cultures and tradition.

"That is the beauty of Nayconf and that is the beauty that the youth have converge to demonstrate and they would continue to demonstrate in the next six days," he said. He added that his ministry will work closely with its satellite institutions to make sure that the youth are engaged meaningfully in the sustenance of peace and security in the country, describing them as champions of peace.

Differently abled delegate calls for more inclusiveness

Persons with disabilities in the country especially youth have been clamoring about the lack of sporting facilities in the rural areas of the country.

Their cry has always been that many sporting facilities are lacking in their regions and even where they are available they are not disability friendly.

Speaking to Musa Sowe, a differently abled delegate from the Upper River Region who is also attending Nayconf for the first have expressed concerned about not only the sporting facilities but also toilet facilities.

Musa who said he was happy to be given the opportunity to attend Nayconf, has also appealed to the national organizing committee to look into their plights.

"We want to be part of nation building and contribute to a successful Nayconf but we are challenged in terms of accessing the toilet facilities. In fact, since we arrived yesterday we couldn't take bath because our wheelchairs can't access the toilets. We want the NOC to at least allocate a restroom for us to be using," he appealed.

Abdoulie Mballow of the Support the Rural for Disabled made similar remarks adding that the lack of trainers as persons with disabilities has immensely affected level their of participation.

"We are challenged with wheelchairs to help in our training and thus need support to fully participate in the Nayconf activities and the subsequent ones," he says.

Meanwhile, similar concerns were raised by Haddy Kanteh and Saikou Njakateh all representing the Upper River Region.

This year's thematic sessions will include: youth migration management, education, entrepreneurship, in the employment, youth industry, creative tourism. and culture, information technology and access to information, aenderbased violence, sexual and reproductive rights and HIV, youth in political participation, Environment, climate change, biodiversity and agriculture.

The week-long event will eventually see young people from all walks of life showcase their talent while discussing issues of national interest, focusing on the strengthening of peace and security in The Gambia.



NAYCONF is essential for Youth Development - Banjul Youth Chair

The host region youth chair said the conference would enable the delegates to identify the issues affecting their well-being and come up with resolutions that would be presented to the government for implementation.

He called on the government to introduce a national youth revolving fund that would be used to empower micro, small and medium enterprises with the needed finances to expand their businesses.

President Adama Barrow has reaffirmed his government's commitment to creating employment opportunities for the young people of the country.

The president made the remarks on Friday in Banjul during the opening of the 13th edition of the National Youth Conference and Festival (Nayconf).

"My government is committed to creating that platform for the youth to excel," President Barrow said

He said his Government through the Ministry of Youth and Sports and other relevant ministries and stakeholders will continue to provide the enabling environment for you to continue to strive and excel in the Gambia without the need to leave the country through dangerous journeys.

The President said with more than 70% of Gambia's population under the age of 35 the Gambia has a lot to tap into from her youthful population. "The Youth play an important role towards the socioeconomic advancement of all country.

He indicated that his government has recently launched the National Employment Policy and Action Plan 2022 – 2026. The NEP 2022-2026, he said aims to create gainful and decent employment opportunities for the growing labour force to improve their living conditions and contribute to economic growth and national development within the framework of equity, fairness, security and dignity.

"It is important to note that the Government of the Gambia is on course towards achieving the Youthconnekt Goals which include creating jobs, and opportunities through education, entrepreneurship and skills, as well as closing the gender gap. To this effect, we wish to thank the UNDP for their support and Youthconnekt Africa Hub for their collaboration," he said.

He said the recently concluded Tekki-fii program supported through the European Union Trust Fund has laid a great foundation for the Promotion of Entrepreneurship and skills training among young people across all spheres of the country's economy.

He informed that the next government's blueprint, "The Recovery Focus National Development Plan" now has youth issues as a pillar of its own and not a critical enabler as in the previous plan.

"The statutory legal and documents of the Ministry of Youth and Sports and its satellite institutions are currently being reviewed including the Acts of the National Youth Council, The National Enterprise Development Initiative, The National Youth Service Scheme, the President's International Awards and The Sports Council. These reviews will put these institutions on a better footing to serve the needs of young people. A five-year Strategic Plan for 2023 - 2025 for the Ministry has also been developed," he noted.

He challenged the youth to take the lead in the promotion of peace in the country. "There is a greater need for the youth to take the lead in making sure that Gambians jealously guard their peace and security that will certainly guarantee prosperity so that generations yet unborn would be proud of us all."

President Barrow urged youth to take the convergence seriously, and debate constructively and come out with attainable resolutions for government.

"The government will obviously help in the implementation of the expected resolutions," he assured.
